Join us on a visit to The Museum of Making situated in the City of Derby on Wednesday 5th October 2022. Enjoy access to 30,000 objects, displayed in the beautifully renovated former Silk Mill on the banks of the River Derwent, and shortlisted for the Art Fund Museum of the Year. We will have a guided tour of this treasure trove of manufactured items accumulated over the last 300 years. The museum is not only about the past but the present too. You will then be free to have lunch and visit Pickfords' House, 41 Friar Gate, a grade 1 listed Georgian townhouse and /or the Museum and Art Gallery, The Strand, home to the world's largest collection of works by Joseph Wright of Derby.

11.30pm	Free time to buy lunch (not included) and visit the other museums, which are only a short walk from the Silk Mill.
